Its vision is to maintain Cardiff Bay as an exceptional water venue offering an excellent environment in which visitors and local communities can enjoy a wide range of activities, sports and leisure pursuits. Within this vision, the Harbour Authority has the objective of maintaining the best environmental standards throughout Cardiff Bay and is committed to protecting the environment and its bio-diversity.

The Harbour Authority will:

- Manage activities to ensure the risk of pollution is controlled, minimised or eliminated;
- Reduce waste to landfill through the adoption of reduction, reuse and recycling practices;
- Minimise and make efficient use of energy in all the Harbour Authority's activities, reduce carbon dioxide emissions and mitigate the impact on global climate change;
- Commit to fulfil its compliance obligations;
- Review performance to commit to the continual improvement of the environmental management system to enhance environmental performance.
- Set environmental objectives which are aligned with the business plan.

The Harbour Authority will manage and address environmental issues by improving its monitoring, intervention, research and training, both internally and through its partnerships with stakeholders.
